

# **Housing Options**

# First-year students are guaranteed a housing space on campus.

You can indicate a housing area and room type preference on your HFS Contract at eliving.psu.edu (deadline to update: noon, May 15). Room assignments are processed in RANDOM ORDER; requested housing preferences are not guaranteed. Once a housing option is filled, students will be assigned to the next available option. Some students may be assigned to supplemental housing – a larger room that accommodates 3-4 or 5-6 roommates and offers the same amenities, with a reduced room rate. ### **Campus Dining**

Penn State offers one of the most flexible meal plans in the country. Located in five residential areas, Campus Dining offers all-you-care-to-eat (one price/meal) and a la carte options (pay/item). Additionally, there are numerous retail options located in the HUB-Robeson Center, our student union building, and throughout campus.

#### **Meal Plans**

Students living on campus will have the Campus Meal Plan as part of the Housing and Food Service (HFS) Contract. It is a required purchase for both the fall and spring semesters, comprised of two cost components: base cost, which covers operational expenses, and dining dollars, which is the amount available on the student's account to use for purchases. There are three (3) levels of spendable dining dollars.

- 65 percent off cash price at all-you-care-to-eat locations
- 65 percent off cash price on prepared items\* at food courts
- 10 percent off-campus price on prepared items\* at specialty fast casual operations in residential areas and specific HUB Dining options (Soup & Garden, Grate Chee and Blue Burrito).

When you accept your admission offer to Penn State online at MyPennState.psu.edu, you will pay the deposit fees and accept the Housing and Food Service (HFS) Contract. The HFS Contract must be accepted with the offer of admission, due to the first-year student residency requirement. Housing preferences can be updated in eLiving until the modification deadline of noon, May 15.
